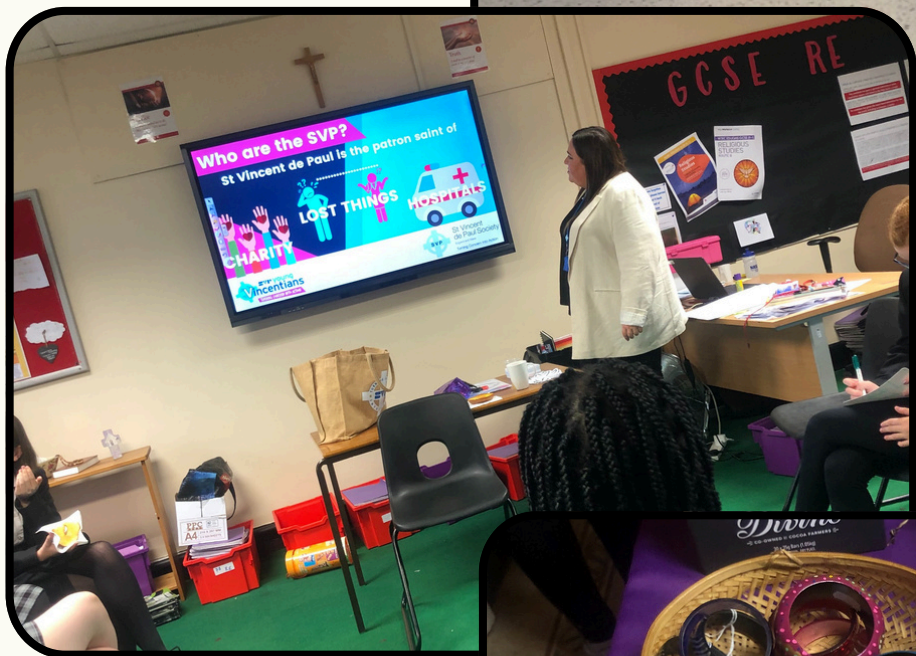

Award Levels

The Faith in Action scheme allows for participation at four levels:

Pin · Bronze · Silver · Gold

The scheme is progressive in nature. For example, pupils may achieve the Pin award in one year and then work towards the Bronze award in the following year.
